Renewal plan Spinozahuis Museum

The renewal plan of the museum consists of three parts.

- a new modern entrance building will create extra space needed to properly receive visitors and introduce them to the museum. It also houses a museum shop and simple catering.
- the garden will be given a facelift and will be integrated in the museum route. Existing elements such as the well-known bust of Spinoza by sculptor Wenkebach and the iconic trees remain untouched.
- 3. and on top of that, a new professionally designed museum exhibition will be mounted.


A new accessible exhibition on the fascinating story of Spinoza's life and ideas, and its impact and significance even for our present time, will appeal to a broader audience. A modern approach which will preserve and even extend its unique historical authenticity.



Spinoza: our greatest philosopher

Living in Rijnsburg Spinoza develops ideas that form the basis of The *Ethics*, his most important book. He develops a revolutionary vision of Reason (the intellect), of God (Nature) and of man and his happiness. His ideas form the basis of the later Enlightenment and are still extremely topical and relevant today. Spinoza is alive and kicking!

Spinoza's fame is evident from the association of his name with the most important Dutch prize for scientists; "The Spinoza Premie". Spinoza is also part of the National Canon of Dutch History, the framework for Dutch history education. His ideas can be linked to current issues such as freedom of expression, democracy and the relationship between religion and politics.

The Golden Age

Spinoza lived in the seventeenth century; the Golden Age. The Netherlands was a tolerant Republic with room for everyone's beliefs while elsewhere in Europe people ended up being burned at the stake for their faith. Freedom acted as a magnet attracting enterprising people exposed to persecution elsewhere: unprecedented prosperity was our share.

Spinoza emphasized that a state of prosperity and happiness could not be reached without freedom. He was both concerned with inner freedom and with political freedom; both to be achieved in a peaceful and prosperous democratic state. Spinoza is considered to be one of the founding fathers of the Enlightenment.

Association Het Spinozahuis

The Spinoza House Association was founded almost 125 years ago to buy, protect and preserve the house Spinoza once lived. The association has been looking after the museum since then. In Rijnsburg, also known as flower village, a team of Spinoza experts and enthusiastic volunteers take care of the museums daily business.
